A Bit of Britain at the MOA!

Have you heard about the fabulous finds in London, UK? The Walbrook site in London has been churning up spectacular artifacts that reveal extraordinary information about the site of *Londinium* in the Roman period (1st-4th c. AD). With anaerobic conditions prevailing (layers without oxygen), unique finds of leather, wood and bone have been found. So, what is the connection to the Museum of Ontario Archaeology? Back in March 1950 archaeologists from the “twin” Londons, Wilfrid Jury and W.F. Grimes, made an exchange of artifacts from their local sites.
